Invitation for material for the weekly sheet

Harvest Service

Next Sunday is our annual Harvest Service and like last year we are encouraging members to support the work of Edinburgh SE Foodbank which operates from the Blythswood Care Shop at 47 Southhouse Broadway.

The following items have been identified as goods which would be appropriate to be passed on to people in crises within our community.

Pasta Sauce (tinned/sachet) – Meat (tinned) – Sponge pudding – Pasta/rice (500g) – Milk (UHT / powder) – Sugar (500g) – Biscuits/snacks – Tomatoes (tinned) - Instant Mash Potato – Vegetables (tinned) – Breakfast Cereal – Fruit Juice – Tea Bags/ Instant coffee – Fish (tinned) – Rice pudding (tinned)

Our collection will be added all that is collected at the Liberton Primary Harvest Assembly and will then be passed on to John Ross and his team to support them in this valuable work.

Blythswood Care Shoebox

The Blythswood Care Shoebox Appeal sorting centre is at Craigmillar Park Church, Craigmillar Park, Edinburgh. Last year, after sorting 5,500 boxes we finished early as the incoming supply ran out! Even though that was 1,500 fewer boxes than in 2010 our work rate had increased (again) from 700 boxes/day to nearly 800 boxes/day. The effort made by all the helpers was fantastic and I thank you all again.

To be manageable it needs lots of volunteers each doing a 3-hour shift; the light work of checking shoeboxes can be done by anyone and we have 6th-year school pupils, students, pensioners and even some disabled all helping. Lifting and moving the outer cartons is heavier work, best suited to those of a more physical disposition; usually men, but not always...so, if you would like to help between 12th and 23rd November then please contact Norman Weibye on 0131 668 3545 (email: mailto:shoebox@weibye.net).
