Liberton Northfield Church Constitution

Edinburgh Presbytery has asked us to bring our Church constitution in line with way that the Church is administered. In 2009 the church moved from having a Session plus Congregation Board to having a Session plus Standing Committees (such as Finance, Property, etc.). This has been clearly stated in the church Annual Reports since 2009, but unfortunately the constitution of the church was not officially updated at that time as required from a "Model" to a "Unitary" constitution. In order for this change to take place officially, the congregation needs to pass a Resolution to adopt the Unitary Constitution at a Congregational Meeting specially called for the purposes by intimation on the two Sundays immediately preceding the meeting. This special meeting will take place after the morning service on Sunday 26th May.
